ANNUAL MEETING WARRANT

To: Michael F. Knox, District Clerk Cherry Valley Sewer District

Greetings:

You are herby directed to notify the Voters of the Cherry Valley Sewer District to meet in the Town Hall Auditorium, 3 Washburn Square, Leicester, Massachusetts Thursday, the 24th day of May, 2007 at 7:00 P.M. then and there to act on the following:

- ARTICLE 1 To elect a Moderator to preside at said meeting and for a period of one (1) year thereafter.
- ARTICLE 2 To act on reports of the District.
- ARTICLE 3 To elect a Sewer Commissioner for a term of three (3) years.
- ARTICLE 4 To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of money from any available means, for the operating budget for Fiscal Year 2008, to provide for the District's annual operating requirements, including but not limited to, salaries, related services, office expenses, maintenance, construction and other items related thereto: to execute any instruments or documents necessary or appropriate to accomplish said purposes: and to take any other action thereon.
- ARTICLE 5 To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds or free cash or otherwise provide the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) to create a reserve account, or take any action thereto.
- ARTICLE 6 To see if the Cherry Valley Sewer District will vote to merge with the Cherry Valley & Rochdale Water District and to further vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds or free cash, or otherwise provide a sum of money as may be necessary to enable the District to pay for, professional services including but not limited to professional engineering services,

accounting services, and legal services and to execute any instruments or documents necessary or appropriate to accomplish said purposes; and to take any other action thereon.

- ARTICLE 7 To see if the District will vote to authorize the Board of Sewer Commissioners to establish a fund to receive and deposit fees paid pursuant to Chapter 33 of the Acts of 1998, and, from which expenditures may be made by the Board of Water Commissioners for legal services, administrative services and engineering services (including but not limited to, design, plan review, and inspection of the project being constructed) in connection with any water system design, review, and construction, or to take any action thereon.
- ARTICLE 8 To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds or free cash, or otherwise provide a sum of money as may be necessary to enable the District to pay for professional engineering services and all costs incidental and related thereto to perform a infiltration and inflow (I/I) study of the District's sewer collection system and further develop infiltration and inflow operations and maintenance program, or take any action thereon.

You are hereby directed to give notice of this Warrant by posting attested copies thereof at two public places within the limits of the Cherry Valley Sewer District and with the Clerk of the Town of Leicester seven days before time of said meeting.

Cherry Valley Sewer District Annual Meeting May 24, 2007

COMMISSIONERS REPORT

To the people of the Cherry Valley Sewer District:

Greetings:

Your Board of Sewer Commissioners respectfully submits their Annual Report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007.

The Commissioners are pleased to report that 327 homes are currently connected to the sewer system.

The Commissioners are in the process of developing plans to reconstruct a section of the sewer line located on Chapel Street. The District discovered a grade problem with the section of sewer main that crosses Kettle Brook at the Brick City Mill Pond. The grade problem was caused by the winter frost that lifted the sewer main thus reducing the designed gravity flow. The sewer main will be re-routed to prevent this from reoccurring in the future.

The District along with the other member communities (Worcester, Millbury, Auburn, Holden, West Boylston and Rutland) of the Upper Blackstone Water Pollution Abatement District (UBWPAD) have received copies of the draft NPDES discharge permit issued by US EPA. Despite the progress and positive results of the multi-million dollar upgrade to the UBWPAD Treatment Facility, US EPA is proposing much more stringent nutrient (phosphorous and nitrogen) limits in the draft 2007 permit. Simply stated, implementation of these provisions will seriously impact this District's sewer rates.

To offset the rate increases, the Board of Sewer Commissioners has applied for and received a Sewer Rate Relief Grant from the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection. The grant has been applied to the sewer rate in an attempt to lessen the impact. The Fiscal Year 2007 Grant installment is \$ 22,982.00.

Several notes of appreciation are in order;

Mr. John Graham, District Treasurer has done a most commendable job for the District this past year. Thank you, John.

ARTICLE IV - FY 2007 BUDGET

Chairman Manseau moved that the District vote to appropriate from available funds, the sum of \$ 258,363.00 (Two-hundred-fifty-eight-thousand, threehundred and sixty-three dollars and no cents), for the operating budget of Fiscal Year 2007, to provide for the District's annual operating requirements, including but not limited to, salaries, related services, office expenses, maintenance, construction, sundry items and other items related thereto.

(The proposed budget was published on page 5 of the 2006 Annual Report, which was in the hands of the voters present.) **Voted: Unanimous. Approved.**

ARTICLE V – RESERVE ACCOUNT

Commissioner Della Cava moved that the District vote to appropriate from available funds, the sum of \$10,000.00 (Ten thousand), to create a reserve account.

Voted: Unanimous. Approved.
